

# Baby Bib Pattern

## Needed:

1 standard-sized washcloth

1 22" x 9" strip or two 11" x 9" squares.

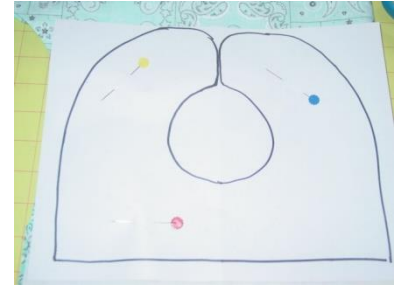
center scrap for pocket

3"x 3" square for "hanky"

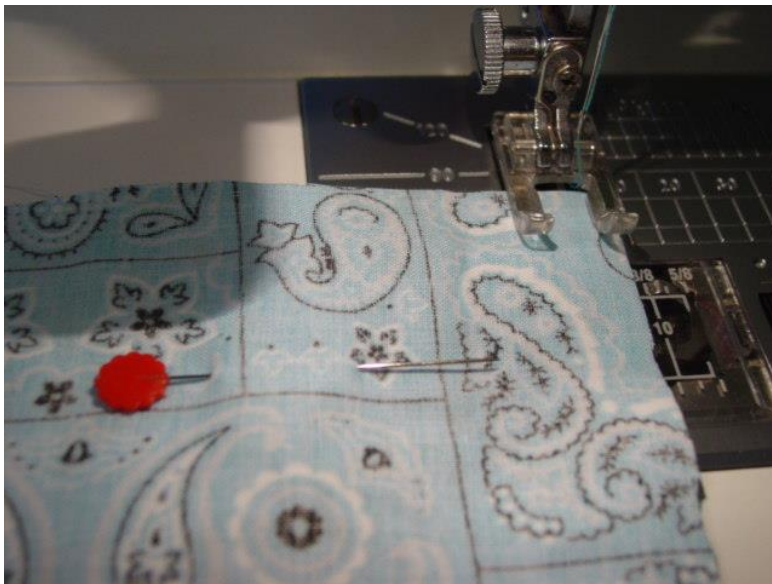
Velcro dot (for closure)

Fabric glue

Pattern - make sure you print to full size. Your pattern should take up a full sheet of paper!



- Lay out your fabric, right sides together.
- Cut 2 (together makes it work better) from the fabric. Keep together and stitch around the edge (1/4" seam), leaving the bottom open.



- Clip to help neck lie flat when turned.



- Turn right-side out and press. Fold 3/8 inch under on bottom and press.

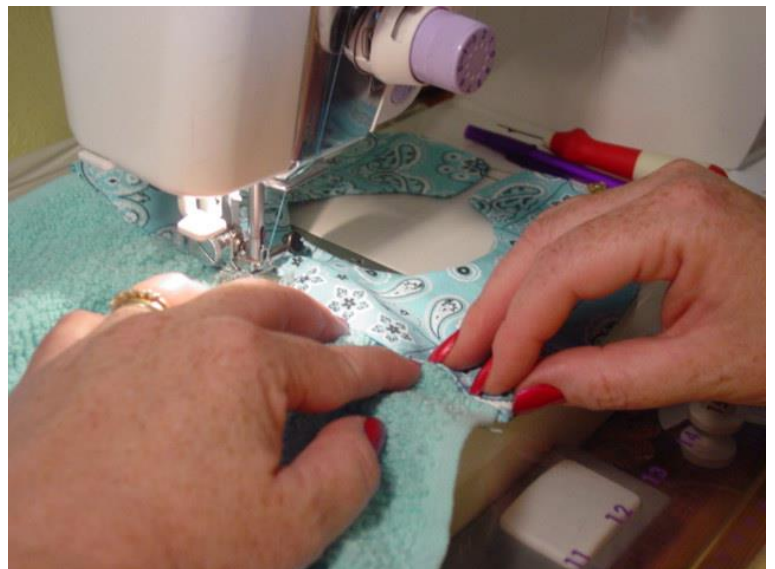
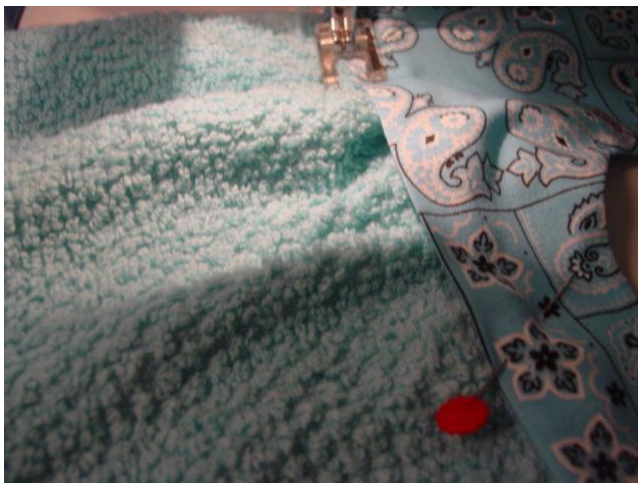


- To add the washcloth, you can either gather the washcloth by stitching two parallel lines of stitches and gather by pulling on the threads prior to stitching it to the upper part of the bib, or you can do it the "quick" way by gently easing in the extra washcloth as you stitch, creating a gathered look without the need to pre-gather before you stitch.
- Mark the center of the bib and the center of the washcloth. Place the washcloth about 1/2 an inch between the two fabrics (like a pocket). Pin the center of the washcloth to the center of the bib.



- Stitch 1/8" to 1/4" along the bottom of bib, tucking/gathering the washcloth as you go. I usually go back and add a second stitch along the bottom of the upper bib to help secure the washcloth . (I

also flip it over to make sure my back is securely stitched to the washcloth.)





- Stitch 1/8" around the edge of the upper bib.



- Overlap the top of the bib and place the Velcro on the bib.
- Stitch Velcro dot on the top of the bib. I use a zigzag stitch or a straight stitch around the Velcro.





To add the pocket:

Using the left-over center and some fabric glue, fold under all around to form a pocket, gluing the edges in place.





Cut "hanky" from scrap, 3" x 3". Fold diagonally. Fold diagonally again. (Prairie point). Place under the pocket, folding in sides of triangle.







Stitch to front of washcloth with a 1/8" seam.  
You are finished!!!



Works great for the smallest of babies and some "babies" that are much bigger!
